

## COVID-19 MEET & GREET GUIDELINES FOR A HOUSEHOLD WITH NO PETS

- 1. All adoption meet & greets MUST take place outside only.
- 2. All humans MUST adhere to social distancing guidelines. No handshaking and social touching.
- 3. All humans MUST wear a mask at all times.
- 4. Medical and contract paperwork will be reviewed over the phone with the foster and adopter the day prior to the scheduled meet & greet.
- 5. Contract and payment must be done on personal devices at the time of the meet & greet.
- 6. At the meet & greet when handing off the dog they will have a leash on their collar (the foster parent's leash). While the leash is still attached the foster parent will hold onto it and step back, at that time the adoptive parents can attach their leash to the collar and step back while still holding the leash. The foster parent can then step forward and remove their leash.

If a party is not following the social distancing measures the other party can ask that they respect the guidelines to ensure safety for all.

If at any time the above guidelines are not being followed or either party feels uncomfortable the meet and greet can be postponed until at a later date.



## COVID-19 MEET & GREET GUIDELINES WITH RESIDENT DOG

- 1. All adoption meet & greets MUST take place outside only.
- 2. All humans MUST adhere to social distancing guidelines. No handshaking and social touching.
- 3. All humans MUST wear a mask at all times.
- 4. Medical and contract paperwork will be reviewed over the phone with the foster and adopter the day prior to the scheduled meet & greet.
- 5. Contract and payment must be done on personal devices at the time of the meet & greet.
- 6. All DOGS must be on a 6-foot leash (no long leads) this will help maintain proper control of the foster and resident dog.
- 7. Slow intro guidelines must be followed when dogs initially meet.
- 8. When going on a walk with both dogs, social distancing must be followed.
- 9. If the meet & greet between both dogs go well and there is no reactivity, aggression, etc. the Adopters can take the dog home at the end of the meet & greet.
- 10. At the meet & greet when handing off the dog they will have a leash on their collar (the foster parent's leash). While the leash is still attached the foster parent will hold onto it and step back, at that time the adoptive parents can attach their leash to the collar and step back while still holding the leash. The foster parent can then step forward and remove their leash.

If a party is not following the social distancing measures the other party can ask that they respect the guidelines to ensure safety for all.

If at any time the above guidelines are not being followed or either party feels uncomfortable the meet and greet can be postponed until at a later date.



## COVID-19 IN HOME MEET & GREET GUIDELINES WITH SMALL ANIMALS

- 1. All humans MUST adhere to social distancing guidelines. No handshaking and social touching.
- 2. All humans MUST wear a mask at all times.
- 3. Medical and contract paperwork will be reviewed over the phone with the foster and adopter the day prior to the scheduled meet & greet.
- 4. Contract and payment must be done on personal devices at the time of the meet & greet.
- 5. All DOGS must be on a 6-foot leash (no long leads) this will help maintain proper control of the foster for when meeting the resident animal.
- 6. Slow intro guidelines must be followed when dogs and resident animal initially meet.
- 7. Majority of meet & greet must be done outside, when the dog is meeting the human adopters this is done outside.
  - a. When dog is ready to meet the resident small animal it must be done in a well ventilated room, all social distancing and personal protective equipment guidelines must be followed
  - b. Only one person (foster) allowed with dog and one person (adopter) allowed with resident small animal in the home.
- 8. If the meet & greet between both dog and resident small animal go well and there is no reactivity, aggression, etc. the Adopters can take the dog home at the end of the meet & greet.
- 9. At the meet & greet when handing off the dog they will have a leash on their collar (the foster parent's leash). While the leash is still attached the foster parent will hold onto it and step back, at that time the adoptive parents can attach their leash to the collar and step back while still holding the leash. The foster parent can then step forward and remove their leash.

If a party is not following the social distancing measures the other party can ask that they respect the guidelines to ensure safety for all.

If at any time the above guidelines are not being followed or either party feels uncomfortable the meet and greet can be postponed until at a later date.
